

Non-breeding distribution and movements of North Atlantic seabirds

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This Theme Section assembles original research articles based on data collected as part of the SEATRACK project—an international seabird tracking program initiated in 2014 and covering the North East Atlantic (SEATRACK). This program is based on Global Location Sensors (GLS or geolocators) to track individuals during the non-breeding season and better understand this crucial part of the annual life cycle of seabirds. Contributions cover a wide range of topics—from the development of seabird distribution maps for marine spatial planning to the study of the relationships between winter oceanographic conditions, winter movements and demography, and of the individual variability in non-breeding movements.
